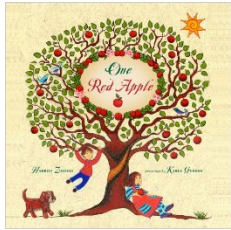


## List of children's apple books to look for at your local bookstore or library

Follow the life cycle of an apple: from fruit growing on the tree to market, to picnic, to seed, to sapling and tree, and finally to a new apple. This simple, joyful book with radiant illustrations introduces readers to the amazing and delectable way the earth provides food. Ages 8+

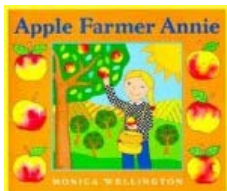
**Up, Up, Up! It's Apple-Picking Time** by Jody Fickes Shapiro  
Myles and his family go to his grandparents' apple ranch, where they have a wonderful time picking and selling apples together. Grades K - 3



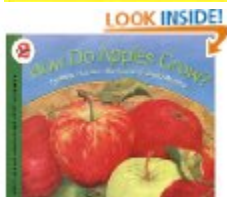
**Johnny Appleseed** by Steven Kellogg

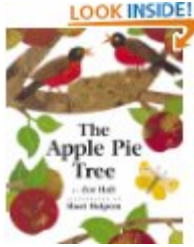
**Johnny Appleseed** by Reeve Lindbergh, Kathy Jakobsen Hallquist (Illustrator)

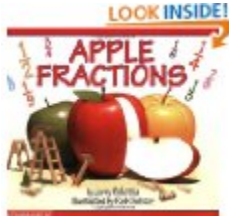


**How Do Apples Grow?** by Betsy Maestro
