

- 9,623 students (Pre-Kindergarten through Grade 12)
- QPS has 4-Year Graduation Rate of 92.7% (higher than state average of 87.3%)
- Dropout rate (0.6%) well below state average
- 85% of QPS graduates plan to attend 2- or 4-year colleges and another 3% enter military service.
- 54% of students are eligible for free or reduced meals
- Title I: 4 elementary schools
- 15% of the population are English Learner Education students and another 12% are Former English Learners being monitored.






- 40% of students live in homes where the first language is not English; 60% Mandarin or Cantonese, followed by 14% Vietnamese, 5% each for Spanish, Portuguese, Arabic, and Indo-European languages
- Per student spending is \$16,976, above the state average of \$16,015
- Average elementary class size K-5 is 20 students; 95% of middle school classes are 24 students or fewer; 83% of high school classes have 25 students or fewer
- Free Full-Day Kindergarten for all students since 2006
- All schools have at least one full-time staff member for nursing, student support, special education, literacy (elementary).










