

PLANT LIFE CYCLE

Place of Learning:

The Classroom or (if weather permits) the F2S Garden

Grade Level: K

Objectives and standards:

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- For students to understand that plants have a life cycle go from seed to plant
- For students to understand how to behave in the garden
- K-LS1-2 (MA) Recognize that all plants and animals grow and change over time

Summary: Students learn about the life cycle of a plant from the book <u>From Seed to Plant</u> by Gail Gibbons and reinforce their learning through "Goga" (Garden Yoga).

Materials

<u>From Seed to Plant</u> by Gail Gibbons Plant life cycle felt board

Preparation:

INTRODUCTION:

In the classroom, read <u>From Seed to Plant</u> with the students and discuss plant life cycle. Explain that I am in the kindergarten class because we are going to go in the garden and harvest some lettuce seeds and we'll watch them grow to be lettuce plants that we will eat.

ACTIVITY:

SEED TO PLANT YOGA:

Tree Pose-"A plant is growing. It lifts its leaves to the sun to make food and rain to make it grow. It keeps growing and growing and growing until...

Mountain Pose -- it makes a fruit or flower that is full of seeds.

Forward Bend--These seeds drop to the ground where

Sukhasana----they wait for water and air.

Child Pose -- The seed turns into a sprout.

Tree Pose – Feeling the sunlight on its leaves, the sprout turns into a plant. It lifts its leaves to the sun to make food and rain to make it grow. It keeps growing and growing until...

REINFORCEMENT:

Ask teachers to have assessed students formally or informally about what they think the life cycle of a plant is. Go over the Garden Rules.
