- o Familiar
- o Impressive
- Large seeded

Cucumbers

- Large seeded
- Pickling potential

Peas

- o Easy early season
- Large seeded

Potatoes

- o Familiar
- Easy to hold
- Fun to dig for

Garden Activity Ideas: Herbs



- Uses 5 senses
- Have many uses
- Fun to eat and smell
- Great for successive harvests
- Easy to dry and make into tea/herb sachets

Garden Activity Ideas: Tool use



- Offers increasing levels of responsibility
- Many age appropriate options
- Start with hands

Tips and Tricks

- Seating areas
- Audible cues
- Aim for uniformity in tools
- Forget about perfection
- Seed poking vs broadcasting
- Seeds vs transplanting
- Favor hardy species (beans, peas, marigolds, sunflowers)
- Use colors as cues
- Big work
- Minimize hazards
- Use grown-ups
